The Sacramento County Mental Health Access Team provides over-the-phone assessments and works to connect people with appropriate providers.

Sacramento Mental Health Urgent Care Clinic

MHUCC is a walk-in clinic that treats Sacramento County residents in the midst of a mental health and/or substance abuse crisis.

ELIGIBILITY FOR SERVICE

We provide services on a walk-in basis to individuals of all ages who are experiencing a mental health and/or co-occurring substance use crisis.

Examples of who might access the urgent care clinic:

- Someone not currently linked to services experiences an unexpected crisis. Clinic staff will provide triage, assessment, and referrals for qualifying services and resources.
- Someone who has been linked to outpatient services but needs to access psychiatric care before it is available where they have been referred. Clinic staff will provide needed urgent care services and communicate treatment with primary provider.
- An individual who is linked to an outpatient provider but missed an appointment and is in need of urgent psychiatric care and medication. Clinic staff will provide needed services, communicate treatment with primary provider, and may set a limit on frequency of urgent care clinic use.
- An individual presenting with a primary substance use disorder or who may be under the influence will be assessed and offered linkage to on-going alcohol and drug treatment services.
- Linked or unlinked individuals experiencing a mental health and/ or co-occurring substance use crisis when their assigned provider is closed, afterhours, or during the weekends/holiday. Clinic staff can help avert the need for an emergency department visit by providing urgent care services, communicating treatment with the outpatient provider (if linked), and arranging appropriate follow-up care.

WellSpace provides primary care, as well as behavioral health care. In particular, WellSpace has <u>Behavioral Health Continuum of Care</u> and <u>Integrated Behavioral Health</u> programs. These programs focus on a variety of issues, including substance use treatment, withdrawal management, and psychotherapy services.

WellSpace offers a sliding fee scale to individuals who are uninsured and not eligible for Medi-Cal, with proof of income.

Crisis Text Line

Text HOME to 741741 to access this service. A live, trained volunteer Crisis Counselor receives the text and responds, all from our secure online platform. This is a 24/7, free service.

The Crisis Text Line does not provide access to licensed mental health professionals, but is a place to talk staffed by unlicensed volunteers when it feels



necessary and other resources are not available. Even though this is not a counseling service, volunteers staffing Crisis Text Line follow similar guidelines as mandated reporters and may disclose information you provide. See the whole policy here: <u>Privacy Policy - Crisis Text Line</u>.
